Attention Oxygen Dependent Residents



POWER OUTAGES MAY AFFECT OXYGEN CONCENTRATORS AND OTHER ELECTRICALLY POWERED MEDICAL EQUIPMENT. **PLAN AHEAD NOW.**

If you rely on **oxygen concentrators** or other **electricity-dependent** medical equipment, please take action early to stay safe during power outages.



ONCE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (GDOE)
EMERGENCY SHELTERS OPEN AT 7:00 A.M. ON SUNDAY, JULY 5, 2026

Oxygen-dependent individuals are advised to report to a shelter where backup power is available.

SHELTERS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT:

- 📍 Talofofo Elementary School for residents of the island's southern villages
- 📍 Ordot Elementary School for residents of the island's central villages
- 📍 Maria A. Ulloa Elementary School, Dededo for residents of the island's northern villages
- 📍 Astumbo Elementary School, Dededo for residents of the island's northern villages
- 📍 Machananao Elementary School, Yigo for residents of the island's northern villages



REGISTRATION AND A VALID PHOTO ID ARE REQUIRED FOR SHELTER ENTRY.



- Do not wait until conditions worsen—make arrangements early.



- Bring an adequate supply of medications, oxygen supplies, chargers, medical equipment, identification, and personal necessities.



- Bring extra batteries and charging cables for medical equipment if available.



- If you use portable oxygen tanks, ensure they are filled before the storm.



- Contact your oxygen supplier as soon as possible if you anticipate needing additional supplies.



CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY
if you experience severe difficulty breathing or your oxygen equipment fails and you cannot safely use a backup supply.

SOUTHERN REGION COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER (INALAHAN) **WILL REMAIN OPEN 24 HOURS**

Beginning at **COR 2** to provide urgent care for non-life threatening medical needs until **COR 4** is announced.



OPERATIONS AFTER COR 4

Once Condition of Readiness (COR) 4 is declared, the Southern Region Community Health Center (Inalahan) will resume normal operations.

The health center will open Monday through Friday from **6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.**

Saturday operations will continue under regular clinic hours from **8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.**

Essential services will be prioritized to support community needs during early recovery.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Refill prescription medications before the storm whenever possible.
- Keep a list of your medications and bring enough medication to last through the storm, if available.
- Patients who rely on electricity for medical equipment, including oxygen concentrators, CPAP machines, or other essential medical devices, should plan ahead for possible power outages. Please follow guidance from the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense regarding shelters and emergency resources.
- For life threatening emergencies, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency department.
