Services for Talo'fo'fo will be announced separately. Residents are encouraged to mark their calendars.


What to bring for Immunizations:

- Child's birth certificate
- Child's current shot record
- Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent. If accompanied by another adult, legal documentation or written authorization from the parent is required.
- Parent, guardian, or authorized adult's valid photo ID

- Children below 18 years of age: Must be accompanied by a parent. If other than parent, adult
 must have legal documents or written authorization from parent.
- · Parent, guardian or authorized adult's photo ID.
