Hafa Adai Madame Speaker,

For the reasons provided below, Bill No. 8-37 will lapse into law without my signature, because it adds yet another layer of bureaucracy to the procurement announcement process by requiring the creation of the "Procurement Announcement Website," which simply provides hyperlinks to documents already posted on agency websites.

Guam law currently requires that procurement notices be posted on a procuring agency's website. For General Services Agency ("GSA") or Department of Public Works ("DPW")-led procurements, which account for most government of Guam procurements for goods and services, and construction, announcements are posted on both the procuring agency's website and the GSA or DPW's website.

Additionally, the Government Public Notices Portal, which the Office of Technology ("OTECH") maintains, further contains a "Procurement Notices" tab, which is utilized by both line and autonomous agencies and allows the public to view the complete procurement announcement for any agency.

Bill 8-37 now requires OTECH to create yet another website that is required to simply provide a link to other websites before the actual procurement documents and notices are provided. In the case of GSA or DPW-led procurements, it creates redundancy upon redundancy for no meaningful purpose.

This bill also violates the principle of separation of powers, by requiring the Judiciary of Guam, an independent branch of the government of Guam pursuant to the Organic Act, to comply with Executive Branch requirements to process procurements. Interestingly, the Guam Legislature does not believe it should be subject to the same "transparency" requirements in its own procurements, as it exempts itself from the online publication requirements it imposes on other branches of the government as in this bill.

While my Administration aims to improve agency processes, Bill 8-37 does not encourage efficiency and transparency or open government, but rather, adds another layer of bureaucracy on critical processes already stymied by legislatively imposed layers of bureaucracy.

For these reasons, Bill No. 8-37 (COR) will lapse into law without my signature as Public Law *37-12*.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that as it currently stands, there is no official website in existence that may be
- 4 accessed online, by the public in regards to viewing all Invitations For Bids (IFBs)

or Requests For Proposals (RFPs) in one place. Under the principles of a transparent and open government, this legislation is to establish an internet-centric public service for the people of Guam in regards to viewing all and any Requests For Proposals (RFPs) and Invitations For Bids (IFBs) that are announced by the Government of Guam. Presently, there exists a website for all public notices, spearheaded by the Governor's Office of Technology. This legislation adds a new §5221, §5222, §5223, §5224, and §5225 to Subarticle B, Article 3, Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, thus amending the Guam Procurement Law. And in doing so, amend by expanding the law to read that the Office of Technology shall establish, secure and maintain a web-based system for Government of Guam agencies to accurately publish in a manner consistent with Chapter 8 of this title, any and all Invitations For Bids (IFBs) and Requests For Proposals (RFPs) on the officially recognized Public Notices Portal of the Government of Guam. The announcements shall be posted on the website at the same time as the posting on the respective agency's website and the newspaper postings.

Section 2. § 5221, §5222, §5223, §5224, and §5225 of Subarticle B, Article 3, Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *added* to read as follows:

"§ 5221. Procurement Announcement Website.

The Government of Guam Office of Technology shall create or cause to create an Executive branch-wide website known as the "Procurement Announcement Website" that contains the descriptions of the goods, services, or construction to be procured, announcement dates, the closing dates, and hyperlinks for all Invitations for Bids (IFB) and Requests for Proposals (RFP) procurement solicitations of departments, agencies, instrumentalities and public corporations of the Executive Branch of the Government of Guam inclusive of autonomous agencies enumerated in 12 GCA, including the Guam Visitor's Bureau and the Judiciary of Guam. The website shall also

include procurement solicitations of the Guam Department of Education, the University of Guam, the Guam Community College and the Guam Election Commission.

The Government of Guam Office of Technology shall implement or cause to implement the requisite systems to afford procuring agencies the capability of posting to the Procurement Announcement Website. This website and its underlying systems shall conform to internationally recognized information security controls, standards and best practices, or at least National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) standards, guidelines and requirements for cloud-based services.

§ 5222. Posting of Information on the Procurement Announcement Website.

The Guam General Services Agency, the Department of Public Works and all other purchasing agencies, with procurement authority, shall post all IFB and RFP procurement solicitations, on their respective websites. The Guam General Services Agency, the Department of Public Works and all other purchasing agencies with procurement authority shall also post the required procurement information, *infra*, on the Procurement Announcement Website by the end of the business day, on the same date that the procurement solicitation is publicly announced. The following information shall be posted on the Procurement Announcement website for each procurement solicitation:

- (a) The solicitation's announcement name, a unique designation for the Procurement Announcement Website and the closing date of the solicitation hyperlinked to their matching procurement solicitations on the source agencies' websites;
- (b) A general description of the goods, services, or construction being procured;
