Subject: **Amendment No. 2**
Re: IFB 26-04; Supply, Deliver, and Install Security X-ray Machines

Below are responses to questions submitted to my office:

1. Given the technical complexity and bid requirements, we are kindly requesting 4 weeks extension for the bid submission to afford us sufficient time to work with our manufacturing partner to prepare our responsive bid and secure the Bid Bond.

Response: Please refer to Amendment no.1. The deadline to submit bids has been changed from May 4, 2026, at 2 pm, Guam Standard Time, to May 18, 2025, at 2 pm, Guam Standard Time.

2. What certificate is being referred to on page 57, Item C Additional Requirements (below):

Note: Awarded bidder shall provide manufacturer's certificate upon delivery of the items listed above. The Judiciary reserves the right to reject the delivery if manufacturer's certificate(s) is not provided.

Response: The manufacturer's certificate referenced in the Additional Requirements is a certificate from the manufacturer confirming that the items delivered conform to the specifications set forth in this solicitation. This certificate must be provided upon delivery.

3. UPS, for the Operating/Control Console for proper shutdown only or for the whole system including the X-ray Scanner to continue scanning for a certain limited time, protection against power outage & electrical anomalies?

Response: The Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) must provide coverage for the entire X-ray security screening system, including the X-ray Scanner, the Operating/Control Console, and all related peripheral components. The UPS should be capable of supporting full scanning operations for a specified, limited period during a power outage or electrical anomaly, ensuring continuous security screening and a safe, orderly shutdown. Bidders are required to specify the rated backup duration and load capacity of their proposed UPS in their technical submissions.

4. Preventive Maintenance for 5 Years, for Service/Labor only or Service/Labor and Parts?

Response: The 5-year Preventive Maintenance Service requirement covers scheduled maintenance service and labor performed by certified technicians. This includes routine servicing such as calibration, inspection, and cleaning necessary to maintain proper operation of the equipment. Replacement parts are not included in the preventive maintenance requirement. Parts are separately covered under the 2-year warranty requirement.

5. Should we opt for electronic submission:

Bidders who choose to submit their proposals by email must ensure that the emailed bid proposal is received by the Judiciary by the Due Date. Bidders are also required to send hard copies of their proposal, which include one original and two copies, via courier service or USPS mail to the specified address above. These hard copies must reach the Judiciary within two weeks of submitting the email proposal. The emailed proposal must be an exact copy of the hard copies; if there are any differences between the emailed submission and the hard copies, the Judiciary will reject the bid proposal.

Submission of hardcopy must be within 2 weeks from email submission, correct?

Response: Yes, that is correct.

6. Further clarification, please specify if you require Single View (w/1 Generator & 1 Monitor) or Dual View (w/2 Generator & 2 Monitors).

Response: Dual View (w/2 Generator & 2 Monitors).

7. Please review the required Safety Compliance – Certifications (below), particularly the TSA:

Safety Compliance	<p>Must comply with local and global safety standards to ensure safe and reliable performance such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Standards *Air Cargo Screening Technology List (ACSTL) Qualifications *STAC Certified *Radiation (21 CFR 1020.40) and electrical safety requirements, and meet proper detection performance standards. <p>Note: Bidders must provide proof and submit in its bid proposal.</p>

Relative to my earlier query on the Single or Dual View (Monitor & Generator) - - Single View scanners have been declared as grandfather technology. They were TSA Qualified before but in 2015 or 2016 , TSA started calling all Single View scanners grandfathered technology and they stopped approving for new scanners. As it is, the Scanners described your technical specifications are smaller than aviation requirements.

Response: The Judiciary acknowledges that the tunnel dimensions specified in the IFB are smaller than standard TSA-certified aviation screening equipment. The specified dimensions reflect the physical space constraints at the Judiciary's facilities. Accordingly, the TSA size requirements referenced in the Safety Compliance section are waived. All other Safety Compliance requirements remain in effect, including compliance with 21 CFR 1020.40 (radiation safety), applicable electrical safety requirements, and proper detection performance standards. Bidders must provide proof of compliance with all applicable safety certifications with their bid submission.

8. Extension of Questions and Concerns Deadline – We respectfully request an extension of the deadline for submission of questions and concerns to allow us sufficient time to consolidate and accommodate inputs from our sources, should they have additional inquiries or require clarifications regarding the requirement.

Response: The deadline to submit questions has been changed from April 23, 2026, at 5 pm, Guam Standard Time, to May 5, 2026, at 5 pm, Guam Standard Time.

9. Extension of Bid Submission Deadline – To allow our suppliers adequate time to provide the necessary details, we kindly request an extension of the bid submission deadline by an additional two (2) weeks from the original due date.

Response: Please refer to Amendment no.1. The deadline to submit bids is changed from May 4, 2026, at 2 pm, Guam Standard Time, to May 18, 2026, at 2 pm, Guam Standard Time

Please be reminded that this Amendment shall be acknowledged in your bids. Failure to acknowledge this Amendment No. 2 shall result in disqualification from this IFB.
