Subject: **Amendment No. 2**
Re: RFHP 26-01; Group Medical and Dental Insurance

Below are responses to questions submitted to my office:

1. Will the Judiciary of Guam be providing the following Exhibits which were not included on the flash drive that was shared?
 - a. Exhibit R – List of Most Utilized Providers
 - b. Exhibit V – Proposed Contract (for markup by offeror)
 - c. Exhibit W – Proposed Certificate (for markup by offeror)

Response: The exhibits listed above were included in the flash drive provided.

2. The SelectCare top medical, dental, and pharmacy provider files rank providers by paid claims. Is it possible for bidders to receive SelectCare's provider rankings by claim count as this would be a more appropriate measure of utilization as related to Exhibit R and a resulting network disruption analysis?

Response: The Judiciary does not have the data requested.

3. Please have SelectCare provide paid premium data by plan by month for FY24-FY26 or SelectCare's rates (employer+employee contribution) for FY24 – FY26.

Response: The Judiciary will issue a separate amendment on this question.

4. Please confirm claim data provided by SelectCare is based on actual paid claim amounts and does not include incurred but not paid claims.

Response: Relevant claim data set forth at Exhibit F indicates claims “plan paid by incurred date”.

5. Please properly define the most beneficial and economical health plan especially when contrasting network options that may significantly differ locally and internationally to be accessed by the Judiciary of Guam members.

Response:

The term “most beneficial and economic healthcare plan” is expressly defined in 4 GCA § 4302(c)(9), which states in part:

The Negotiating Team upon selection and review of the best available proposal by participating healthcare respondent(s)/provider(s), which reflect the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal plans... Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation, the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal plan for government of Guam employees and retirees, and foster children, shall be defined as the lowest cost option.

The Judiciary is additionally guided by the terms of RFHP No. 26-01, including but not limited to, Part III(C)(6), which states in part:

Upon receipt of best and final offers, the Judiciary will evaluate the best and final offers based on the criteria as indicated in Exhibit C. The three (3) highest ranking qualified proposals will be forwarded to the Administrator of the Courts for consideration and selection of the most economical and beneficial plan (lowest cost option).

6. Will the Judiciary change the contribution to benefits for FY2027.

Response: The Judiciary has not yet determined whether it will change its contribution to benefits.

Please be reminded that this Amendment shall be acknowledged in your proposals. Failure to acknowledge this Amendment No. 2 shall result in disqualification from this RFHP.
