Sablan informed the EMSC that the Legislature will hold a public hearing of Bill 335-36 on 10/14/2022. The Speaker has requested the HPLO to provide a financial impact assessment. She encouraged the EMSC members to attend the public hearing and to provide a statement of support on the bill. |      |                                      | <ul> <li>C. Ambulance Diversion Policy and Interfacility Transfer.</li> <li>1. Dr. Ross indicated that the current draft will be updated depending on the EMSC's decision today on the recommendation to approve GMRC as the Primary Stroke Center on Guam under a separate agenda item.</li> <li>a. In reference to the medical transport for stroke victims: <ol> <li>Dr. von Trampe relayed Dr, S. Shay's concern about transport times for possible stroke victims/patients once a diagnosis is determined due to the time sensitivity to prevent further brain damage; therefore, he wanted to ensure that these transports are not delayed by waiting in the queue. C. Muna stated transport for these patients are treated the same for E911 transports without delay; delays are primarily caused by the lack of emergency transport at the time of the requirement. In addition, emergency dispatchers are trained to ask the right questions. Dr. Wielaard stated that GMRC is offering to equip emergency transports with glucometers, as the readings are part of the assessment to determine if a patient is showing signs of a stroke. The Chair welcomed the offer and requested that dissemination of the glucometers be coordinated with D. Burrier, who stated that GFD personnel are trained in using this device. It is important to ensure EMS personnel are trained.</li> <li>iii. Dr. von Trampe also stated that Dr. Shay is offering refresher training on stroke recognition for emergency personnel. D. Burrier welcomed the offer and suggested that this training count for CEUs for recertification. In addition, the Chair suggested that training could also be open to all paramedics and included in GCCs curriculum. The Chair expressed his appreciation to GMRC.</li> <li>2. The EMSC noted an increase of diversions for the past couple of months at GMHA, GMRC and USNH. D. Burrier reported one diversion case where there was a delay upon arrival; however, after discussion with the Charge Nurse and the ER physician a bed was eventually made available. Some issues the EMSC should address are:  a. Better communications between dispatch and hospitals on emergency room bed space prior to arrival.</li> <li>b. Consider need to establish another category of diversion, e.g., better coordination when saturation levels are reaching capacity, possibility of increasing number of receivables at the same location when saturation levels dictate; etc.</li> <li>c. Working with emergency dispatch centers on staging and queue based on saturation levels</li> <li>3. Dr. Mendiola stated that he would discuss the above with the GMRC Medical Director with the aim to improve communications when diverting patients and medical care is delayed due high saturation levels and to help minimize conflict between hospital personnel and emergency dispatch personnel during these periods that may sometimes lead to other problems, such as poor bed-side manner, misunderstanding, etc. M, Guayco request</li></ul> | PARIT       | Ilmetrane              |                  |

Guayco reported that GMHA continues to report its saturation of bedspace and there is good coordination between GMHA and GMRC for adult and pediatric emergency admissions. He reported there was one situation where a patient was transported in a private vehicle from another hospital. For hospital-to-hospital transports, it is the responsibility of the sending facility to ensure patients are safely transported from one hospital to another.</li> <li>Guam Community College (Paramedic Program Update): D. Duenas reported that the final cohort returned from training in Tyler TX and upon successful passing of the NREMT exam that will be certified as entry-level paramedics. To date, 13 of 15 have passed the exam and GCC is working on a solution to have two of the students retested. Mr. Tilton stated that he is working with GCC to send an analyst exam coordinator to Guam for the testing. Once this process is established, he stated that it would continue to work with GCC in establishing a program in Guam once potential local testing representatives are identified to be trained. With respect to the EMT Program, D. Duenas stated that 22<sup>nd</sup> cohort of fire academy candidates recently completed the program; all tested and passed NREMT exam.
