IV. 001-25	GUEST SPEAKERS –
A.	Felix Reyes and Zach Yamada – Western Pacific Regional Fishery
	Felix Reyes introduces Zach Yamada and Alex Min, who will share information
	about community consultation meetings. Zach Yamada explains their
	presence, mentioning funding from the Inflation Reduction Act for
	community meetings. Alex Min presents feedback from 18 community
	meetings across the region, highlighting climate change, ecosystem changes,
	and community concerns. Alex Min discusses a capacity-building program
	and the importance of community voices in fisheries management. Alex Min
	shares key points from community feedback, including ecosystem changes,
	habitat shifts, and species cycles. Concerns about rising costs, shark
	depredation, and the need for youth stewardship and accessible data are
	discussed. Recommendations include youth stewardship, community-led
	monitoring, clear boundary markers, and managing cultural concerns. Alex
	Min outlines future meetings and workshops, emphasizing the importance of
	community voices in decision-making. Mayor Alig opens the floor for
	questions, with Mayor Hofmann asking about food security and access to
	sustainable local fish. Alex Min responds, mentioning the need for more
	fishermen to sustainably harvest fish.
В.	Kylon Eckert – Teacher, Harvest Christian Academy
	Mayor Alig thanks the guest speakers and introduces the next guest speaker,
	Kylan Eckert from Harvest Christian Academy. Kylan Eckert presents his
	proposal for redesigning village flags to make them more effective and
	culturally relevant. He discusses design principles such as simplicity,
	meaningful symbolism, and avoiding duplication. Kylan shares examples of
i	redesigned flags for various villages, emphasizing the importance of
	community involvement. Mayor Alig supports the idea and suggests forming
	a committee to work on flag redesigns with each mayor's office.
C.	Mayor Alig introduces Miguel Bordallo from GWA to discuss the presence of
	dieldrin in Guam's aquifer. Miguel provides a detailed history of dieldrin use
	and its presence in Guam's groundwater. He explains the lack of federal
	regulation for dieldrin and GWA's efforts to monitor and report its presence.
	Miguel outlines GWA's actions to address dieldrin, including planning and
	engineering for treatment systems. Miguel details GWA's efforts to design
	and construct treatment systems for affected wells. He discusses the
	procurement process and the timeline for completing the interim and
73.	permanent solutions. Miguel addresses concerns about the impact of
	shutting down wells and the need for operational adjustments. He mentions
	the development of a water safety information site and the provision of
	bottled water to affected customers. Mayor Hofmann asks about the
	frequency of water quality reports and the coordination with the military's

testing. Miguel explains the timing of water quality reports and the
independence of different water systems. Mayor Alig and other mayors ask
about the timeline for interim solutions and the availability of bottled water.
Miguel provides detailed answers, emphasizing GWA's proactive efforts and
the importance of clear communication with the public. Vice Mayor Ann
inquires about the frequency of updates for the FAQs provided by GWA and
Guam EPA. Miguel explains that the FAQs will remain updated, and bi-weekly
updates will be issued jointly with Guam EPA. Vice Mayor Ann expresses
concerns about exposure to contaminated water, including drinking and
bathing. Miguel defers to Guam EPA and their toxicologists for guidance on
water quality and advisory updates. Vice Mayor Ann asks about the timeline
for detecting exposure to contaminated water. Miguel advises consulting a
physician for special conditions or concerns regarding drinking water. Mayor
Arroyo thanks Miguel Bordallo for his availability and hard work. Miguel
acknowledges the presence of various mayors and their questions, including
a request for water testing. Miguel explains the process for sampling and
testing for deodorant, including the cost and logistics. Mayor Arroyo inquires
about the financial and administrative steps for requesting water testing.
Miguel clarifies that local laboratory testing is available without additional
cost, while off-island testing is more expensive. Mayor Arroyo thanks Miguel
for the detailed explanation and acknowledges the challenges of island-wide
 testing.
Mayor Alig introduces Attorney Killman as the legal counsel present.

	Executive Director Joy Jean reports on the procurement matters and the awarding of the tire bid to Guahan Waste Control and Ms. Jo Ann will be the point of contact and ready to assist with their needs.
	Executive Director Joy Jean provides an update on the executive director's annual performance report and the progress in finance, human resources, procurement, and partnering programs.
	Mayor Alig inquires about the status of AV or IT personnel hiring and the challenges faced.
	Executive Director Joy Jean confirms that the recruitment process is ongoing, and the council is considering a classified recruitment process.
	Mayor Alig asks for updates on the software and vehicle purchases, and Joy Jean provides details on the progress and challenges.

	Mayor Alig asks if Mayor Hofmann has anything to report on the Christmas Committee. Mayor Hofmann notes that Mayor Alig asked Mayor Hofmann to chair the Christmas Committee. Mayor Hofmann informs that the Christmas will be on December 12 th at Leo Palace and his team will be reaching out to get representatives.

IX. 006-25	UNFINISHED BUSINESS
A .	FY2026 Budget - Mayor Alig reviews the FY 2026 budget and the need to reconsider certain line items due to budget reductions. The council discusses the need for internet services upgrade and the potential impact of a federal grant on the budget. The council debates the cost and necessity of training for district-wide training and the potential impact on the budget. Mayor Alig and the council discuss the allocation of funds for training and the importance of investing in staff development. The council discusses the

> allocation of funds for heavy equipment and the potential impact on vehicle maintenance. Mayor Hofmann suggests dividing the funds among the districts for rental or purchase of heavy equipment. The council debates the need for centralized control of heavy equipment versus district-specific allocation. Mayor Alig and the council agree to remove the heavy equipment line item and consider future allocations based on need. The council reviews the final budget adjustments, including the removal of the heavy equipment line item and the allocation of funds for training and other needs. Mayor Alig emphasizes the importance of making informed decisions and ensuring the budget reflects the council's priorities. Mayor Alig calls for a motion to distribute \$440,000 to 19 villages equally by Mayor Gumataotao and seconded by Mayor Arroyo. Mayor Hofmann emphasizes the importance of decentralized budgeting, urging mayors to allocate funds responsibly for staff training and other necessary expenses. Mayor Alig confirms the motion passed with 15 votes in favor. Discussion on allocating an additional \$2 million for operations, with a motion by Vice Mayor Bautista and seconded by Mayor Chargualaf. Mayor Alig motions to support for the Chamorro language program and student exchange program, Motion carries. MCOG Standard Operating Procedures - Mayor Alig discusses pending amendments to the standing operating procedures (SOPs) and the need for timelines for deposits and invoicing. Executive Director Joy Jean informs the council that procurement requests over \$15,000 must go through the General Service Agency (GSA). Mayor Hofmann suggests advocating for the Mayor's Council to have procurement delegation up to a certain level, such as \$50,000. Joy Jean explains that DPW currently holds the authority for construction procurement, but Mayor Hofmann argues for more autonomy for the Mayor's Council. 81st Guam Liberation - Mayor Terlaje expresses disappointment over the decision to allow the Queen's float to proceed without the full royal court present. Mayor Hofmann suggests adopting an order of march to ensure proper parade organization and avoid such incidents in the future. Mayor Susuico supports the idea, emphasizing the need for better planning and coordination to avoid rushing the parade. Mayor Alig thanks Mayor B! for his leadership and asks for comments on the financial closeout of the 81st Guam liberation. Mayor Susuico reports that the financial section of the 81st liberation is closed out, but some checks have not cleared yet. Mayor Alig suggests waiting until the November meeting to make a final decision on the financial accounting. Mayor Terlaje expresses interest in continuing as chairman for the 82nd liberation, with the support of the 81st liberation committee. Mayor Alig asks the council if they want to continue organizing the liberation festivities, considering the challenges and legal requirements.

Senior Center Operations - Mayor Allg discusses the need to renew the contract for senior center operations, expressing concerns about the financial sustainability and the role of public health. Mayor Hofmann highlights the need for better maintenance and support for senior centers, suggesting a review of the contract terms and deliverables. Mayor Alig proposes a meeting on October 6 to discuss the renewal, emphasizing the importance of equitable funding and participation. Executive Director Joy Jean clarifies the legal requirements for renewing the contract and the need to ensure proper funding and operations.
