# Pope calls on EU to defend democracy

ATHENS, Greece - Pope Francis praised the achievements of European politics while warning against the enemies of democracy during his visit to Greece on Saturday.

"Democracy was born here," the pontiff said in Athens, after being greeted by President Katerina Sakellaropoulou on the second leg of his eastern Mediterranean trip.

"From the cradle, millennia later, became a house, a great house of democratic peoples: I refer to the European Union and to the dream of peace and fraternity that it represents



for many peoples," Francis said.

The head of the Catholic Church underlined Greece's central role in history in his speech, which was peppered with references to the classical authors, thinkers and scholars of antiquity such as Homer, Aristotle and Hippocrates.

"Without Athens and Greece, Europe and the world would not be what they are," Francis said. "They would be less wise and less happy."

But now it is important not to lose what has been achieved, the Catholic leader warned. One can "only note with concern that it is not only on the

European continent that there is a regression in democracy."

Some societies are numbed by consumption, tired and dissatisfied with democracy. He therefore called on everyone to participate in public life and politics and to be patient.

At the same time, he said, there is skepticism about democracy because of, for example, too much bureaucracy or a certain loss of identity.

"The remedy for this does not lie in the obsessive search for popularity, in the addiction to attention, in announcing impossible promises or in agreeing to abstract ideological colonization, but in good politics," the pontiff emphasized.

## Pair's murder trials moved to next year

The separate murder trials for the couple accused of killing former Humåtak Mayor Daniel Quinata Sanchez have been delayed until next

Defendants Joyner Scott Sked and her boyfriend Rudy Quinata appeared before Superior Court of Guam Judge Vernon Perez on Tuesday.

Sked's attorney Terence Timblin told the court he has yet to receive evidence needed to prepare for trial.

Assistant Attorney General Leonardo Rapadas said the evidence should be handed over by the end of the day.

The pair had their cases severed and will go to trial separately.

Sked's trial is scheduled to begin on Jan. 5, 2022, and Quinata's trial will follow.

Both have pleaded not guilty to murder as a first-degree felony and assault as a second-degree felony.

According to court documents, Sanchez was found beaten and stabbed at least 10 times back in April.

Quinata had a manslaughter conviction in the 1980s. Sked has an arrest record from when her 1-year-old child was found wandering on a street.

Authorities were patrolling along the Achang Reef Flat Marine Preserve area when they saw a truck that did not have a visible license plate.


Officers ran a check of the Vehicle Identification Number on the truck and confirmed it had been reported stolen.

### Sentencing delayed for man who admitted to eating turtle

A man who admitted that he bought a green sea turtle to eat was hoping to learn his fate in the District Court of Guam last Monday.

federal prosecutors.

Luther, 47, had pleaded guilty to possession of a threatened species, admitting he paid \$75 for a dead turtle to have as a meal.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Stephen Leon Guerrero recommended Luther be sentenced to one year of probation and 75 hours of community service.

Chief Judge Frances Tydingco-Gatewood previously noted that Luther did not have any criminal history and asked the government why they did not offer him the option of a diversion.

Under the law, it's our position that it really doesn't matter if the turtle is dead or alive," said Leon Guerrero during the Dec. 6 sentencing hearing.

"So you are saying there are other federal cases in the nation where other defendants purchased a dead turtle like this defendant?" said Tydingco-Gatewood.

"I have at least two cases I was able to find," Leon Guerrero said, "Similar in the sense that one was in possession of turtle meat in the District of Puerto Rico."

"But that's not the case here. The defendant was not in possession of turtle meat," she said.

"He purchased the dead turtle and told agents he took it to his house. ... He possessed it and knew it was illegal," he said. "There's another case in the District of the Virgin Islands where law enforcement stopped a ship captain and when they had approached him, he had tossed the content from a cooler that was found to be a turtle shell cut in half, the front part and head of the turtle was gone."

"The facts are different," she said.

"It's the government's position that we don't think they are," he said, as he brought up a third case in which a defendant in the Northern Mariana Islands served time for possessing dead fruit bats.

"This defendant had four fruit bats in his freezer in his residence," he said.

Tydingco-Gatewood said she wants more time to review the cases to determine how it relates to Luther's case.
