

Varghese and B. Manzana's investigation in cooperation with Legal Counsel R. Weinberg; they served Ms. Mian documents and awaiting her response.
- R. Weinberg stated he spoke to Ms. Mian on the phone today and she stated she understands the document now.
- e. R. Weinberg mentioned he explained to Ms. Mian the critical parts of the documents are:
  - 1) Acknowledgement of admission that she had been writing prescriptions.
  - 2) Terms of the discipline (R. Weinberg read the terms).
- f. R. Weinberg asked Ms. Mian if she is still working as a CNA (Certified Nurse Assistant) and she replied no. He also asked her what does she do there and she replied, billing, working at the front desk and answering the phone.
- g. R. Weinberg stated that if the board (other than the investigators) accepted the terms, then Ms. Mian and the Board can sign the document.
- Chairperson asked Ms. Mian if it is her intent to apply for recertification of her CNA from the Board and she replied yes.
- i. Former Chairperson Kevin Hitosis asked if the Board sent a letter to Dr. Lim's office. A. Varghese stated as part of the investigation, they interviewed Dr. Lim.
- j. A. Cruz asked Ms. Mian if she and Dr. Lim ever speak about a plan to prevent this problem again and Ms. Mian stated there is a covering doctor whenever Dr. Lim is off-island.

  a phone call when she called her and she said, Oh hi

  said that.
- R. Weinberg stated this is a really serious charge. He mentioned that a Pharmacy board member who received the prescription. He stated this is very serious and he will probably suggest to the Nursing or Pharmacy board to refer this for prosecution.
- m. Chairperson is not comfortable in making a decision right now and requested to table for further review of new development; Board agreed.
- n. Ms. Mian asked how long and felt uncomfortable and felt a lot of pressure. She mentioned when the Police came to the clinic they did not have papers. Chair replied that this board never called the Police. She added that if this is not settled, she cannot concentrate with all her anxiety.
- o. R. Weinberg informed Ms. Mian the Board needs time to think about whether they want to accept the settlement, the new facts and her presentation before the Board. He informed her that the Board will get back to her.

#### 6. GBNE-CO-18-016

- b. A. Cruz stated this is a travel nurse who was assigned patients and left without caring for them, therefore the accusation is abandonment. She did not have access to the Pyxis machine used for dispensing medication and she informed her supervisor stating she won't accept the patients and that she was leaving. She also called her contracting agency that day to informed them that she resigned from GRMC and does not want to work there anymore.

#### DRAFT RULE – USE OF VIDEO TELECONFERENCING AT BOARD MEETINGS

#### § . MEETING PARTICIPATION BY VIDEO TELECONFERENCE.

- (a) Board members are expected to make every effort to attend meetings in person. There are times, however, when personal attendance is not possible. Under exceptional circumstances, a board member may participate in a meeting of the Board by video teleconference *provided* that all persons participating in the meeting are able to hear one another other, and provided further that the provisions of the Open Government Law concerning public access to witness the meeting are observed.
- (b) Participation in a board meeting by video teleconferencing constitutes presence in person at the meeting for purposes of establishing a quorum. A majority of the board members participating in a board meeting must be physically present when a board member participates via video teleconference. Meetings may not be chaired by video teleconference. Executive sessions and due process hearings shall not be conducted via video teleconference. Voting shall be by roll call only.
- (c) Board members may attend only two board meetings per year via video teleconference. New board members must attend at least two board meetings in person before attending a meeting via video teleconference.
- (d) A board member who intends to participate in a meeting by means of video teleconferencing shall submit a written request by electronic email to the chair at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting, and a copy of the request shall be attached to the minutes of the meeting. The board member's location and means of attendance shall be noted on the agenda and recorded in the minutes. Board members participating by video teleconference shall identify themselves each time the board member addresses the Board.
- (e) The chair may cause or direct the temporary disconnection or muting of a member's connection if it is causing undue interference with the meeting, and the chair's decision to do so shall be recorded in the minutes. In the event it is determined by the Chair that either the absent board member or the board members in attendance cannot be heard by one another, the video teleconference shall be terminated, and the absent board member shall not be permitted to vote, nor continue to be counted toward a quorum.



# IHOP launches streamlined, affordable

Richard Hart, the president and CEO of Apple Pacific Restaurant Group, is more of a behind-thescenes type of guy, by his own admission. But when the company decided to refocus strategy at one of its restaurants, Hart felt he needed to be the one to take the lead in reaching out and letting the public know about the change.

Hart came to Guam 20 years ago and worked his way up from a server at Outback Steakhouse to the head of a company that runs several local chains including IHOP, Applebee's, Pieology and, most recently, Olive

Success is not new to Hart, but he is also willing to admit when his company could have done better.

Hart recently took a good, hard look at the IHOP location in Tamuning and decided change was needed.

"There is a certain level of expectation that people have when they walk in," he said of the restaurant, "There have been times when maybe that has not gone the way it's supposed to go."

Having opened six properties on

Guam in the last five years - IHOP Tamuning turns 4 this summer - Hart is the first to admit that, sometimes, 'things fall through the cracks."

#### 'If I were a customer ...

So, Hart decided to look at things the way a customer would. He slid into a booth, ordered a table of food and asked himself, "If I were a customer, what would this be worth to me?"

"I realized it wasn't worth what we were charging," he said. "I think it's important that we are honest about that."

Hart got out his figurative knife, started slashing prices and, "brought it back in line with our competition."

The company also reassessed what IHOP was serving cutting 51 menu items and adding 12.

"We do have local items, but we have scaled them back to the items we feel customers were telling us they wanted." he said.

#### Doing what they do best

Hart said it is a matter of knowing who they are and doing what they do best, and "executing that properly for people that are coming in with their children, with their families."

Though Hart knows he is taking a risk, he said he is confident in his team and is hopeful customers will give them another chance to regain their trust.

"We are looking forward to people coming in and giving it a try," he said.

MANILA (Reuters) - Impunity and unlawful killings continue unabated three years into the Philippines' war on drugs, with a pattern of executions under the guise of police sting operations and a state unwilling to investigate them, a report said on Monday.

The London-based Amnesty International in its report "They Just Kill" urged the United Nations Human Rights Council to approve a resolution calling for an investigation into the Philippines, where there was now a "perilous normalization" of illegal executions and police abuses.

A vote on the resolution by the 47-member council is expected later this week.

### Hong Kong police arrest 6 at Kowloon protest

HONG KONG (Reuters) Police arrested six people during
a demonstration in one of Hong
Kong's most popular tourist
areas on Sunday, where thousands of protesters sought to
raise awareness among mainland Chinese visitors about the
political crisis that has rocked
the city.

Protest organizers said 230,000 people marched through the streets of Kowloon, across the harbor from Hong Kong's Central business district, in the latest wave of demonstrations against an extradition bill that would allow people to be sent to mainland China to face trial.

Police put the number at 56,000 at its peak.

Chinese censors have worked hard to erase or block news of Hong Kong's biggest and most violent protests in decades amid fears they could inspire demonstrations on the mainland.

Hong Kong's embattled leader Carrie Lam suspended the extradition bill after violent protests last month when police fired rubber bullets and tear gas, but she has rejected calls to scrap it.


