	(1) GBME-CO-19-010 – Received: Dr. Adolphson reported that the complaint was reviewed by two off-island orthopedic surgeons, who concluded there was no medical negligence nor a deviation in the standard of care. Dr. Adolphson read the summary from one of the investigative reports and indicated that the other investigative report had a similar conclusion. The Chair inquired if she determined if the reports came from licensed clinicians; and Dr. Adolphson did not review their individual Curriculum Vitae; however, the reports were signed with their credentials. Dr. David stated that since the conclusions came from two independent orthopedic physicians with similar conclusions she was satisfied with the conclusions. <i>Motion to close: Dr. Adolphson; 2nd: Dr. David</i>

Dr. Bordallo stated that she received the report from a forensic psychiatrist as the expert reviewer, which concluded that there was a severe departure from the stand of care, secondary to unprofessional terminology and serious boundary violations. Based on the information presented, she supported the conclusion that there was a violation of the standard of care. The second issue is the applicant was outside the window for a renewal for reinstatement, therefore, the application is considered a “new” application (i.e., not a renewal application). During a review of the application, in parallel, the Office of the Attorney General concluded there was probable cause to charge official misconduct and harassment. Therefore, she recommends to deny application for licensure. fastest qualifying time for the All-Island meet. His teammate Hugh Kent is a proven champion, as is Guam High's Alex Rink, and all three will jostle for podium spots in the 800m, the 1,500m and the 3,000m runs. Kent is the odds-on favorite in the longer distances.

Cameron Brantley remains the one to beat in the hurdles, and he is also part of the 4x400 relay team for the Panthers. Aguon is the season's best triple jumper so far, but he's got Johnson and Gallego to contend with in the long jump. Gallego qualified in third place, doing the event for the first time on Monday.

Southern High junior Jhavin Maniebo has the best qualifying throws in the shot put and discus, and Hanzelrein Arellano is the only athlete to break 40



meters in the javelin. Along with Zian Benavente, Imazu and Isaac Valdez, John F. Kennedy High has the best four distances.

In the girls division, Kail-ee Guerrero is still the fastest high school athlete with the top qualifying times in the 100m and 200m sprints. She set a personal best 28.22 seconds in the 200m, and is also in the mix in the 400m with the second-fastest qualifying time.

George Washington High School's Jordan Baden finished well ahead of the pack in the 800m, setting a personal best time of

2:30.04, more than seven seconds better than the second-place qualifier, Marie Jane Gatabonton from Simon Sanchez High School.

Baden also ran a blazing personal best 5:12.59 in the 1,500m run on Monday, which is almost half a lap faster than the next best qualifier, Molly Lang from Guam High. Baden also is the top qualifier for the 3,000m at 11:46.56 — more than a full minute ahead of the next best qualifier.

Aleah Castro remains the favorite in the hurdles, and GW's Melody Rosario is the favorite in the shot put

and discus.

China draws out as hosts of Asia Cup

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP) — China withdrew as host of soccer's 2023 Asian Cup on Saturday in the latest cancellation of the country's sports hosting duties during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Asian Football Confederation praised Chinese soccer officials for making "this very difficult but necessary decision in the collective interests of the AFC Asian Cup."

The 24-nation tournament was due to be played in 10 cities in mostly newly built stadiums in June and July of next year.

China's withdrawal could let Qatar or Saudi Arabia

step up as hosts while both are bidding in a contest to host the 2027 edition. India and Iran are also candidates for the 2027 edition with a decision expected early next year.

Qatar has stadiums in place to host the 2022 World Cup kicking off in November. However, a June 2023 start for the Asian Cup could be unlikely because of the extreme heat in the Qatari summer, making early 2024 a better option.

The quadrennial Asian Cup is traditionally played in January and February. Qatar (2011) and Australia (2015) hosted the tournament when it was played

in January, while the 2019 event in the United Arab Emirates was held from Jan. 5 to Feb. 1.

Qatar is the defending champion after it upset Japan 3-1 in the 2019 final to earn the country's first major soccer title.

China was due to host the 2022 Asian Games in Hangzhou in September but that was postponed along with nearly all international sports events in the country. China did host the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing though under a strict lockdown for athletes and officials with few fans able to attend.
