VI.	Chairperson's Report	<p>The Chair provided a summary of the Federation State Medical Board (FSMB) meeting:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Overall, an excellent meeting. He had the opportunity to meet with HI, VI and PR representatives to discuss current challenges. There was agreement to convene a virtual meeting in the near future to discuss challenges and perspectives. 2) Issues addressed by the GBME are not unique but are common among other jurisdictions, such as the shortage of investigators. It was suggested that there could be a possibility to share investigators among different specialties and obtain discounted rates. 3) The FSMB supports the Interstate Medical Licensing Compact (IMLCC). The IMLCC provides uniformed conduct and accommodates mobility of physicians across jurisdictions. The FSMB is of the opinion that the IMLCC is good for Guam and the US. 4) In reference to physicians, who have alcohol or substance abuse challenges, there is support for an "impaired professional program" to address mental health and substance abuse issues. Some jurisdictions obtain support for other organizations to assist through education, prevention, evaluation, treatment, and monitoring, where the professional pays. Overall, objective would be to help professionals to get better, so that they could continue to be working in their related field. He stated that the Virgin Islands is interested in working with GBME to jointly work on a program. A professional's involvement would have to remain extremely confidential unless they decide to no longer participate in a program. 5) Lastly, he addressed the high burn-out rate of physicians, especially as a result of the stresses related providing treatment during the COVID pandemic (e.g. witnessing death and impact on families, etc). Medical professionals are confronted with mental health challenges; however, many do not seek help or admit to their challenges for fear of punitive action against them. Seventy-five percent of physicians surveyed felt that admission to mental health challenges would result in punitive action versus being healthcare oriented. In addition, the suicide rate among physicians has increased, which does not consider those deaths by accident with suicide intent. Therefore, he felt that the issue is significant enough to help educate other professionals and other medical entities and to encourage addressing mental health needs in accreditation policies, rules and regulations, license, and renewal application processes, etc. Dr. David suggested taking proactive preventive measures and initiatives, such as mental screening, collaborate with and access GBHWC services, etc. She also indicated that Guam's 988 suicide help-line will soon be linked with the national system. Navasca

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ca has had students with different skill sets looking to develop the functional skills of Filipino martial arts. "I've trained people from all walks of life ranging from military personnel on and off-base, members of law enforcement and everyday people who want to learn how to defend themselves using various tools and such," he said.

He recently expanded the classes to include children, however, he does have one rule when it comes to teaching kids, "at least one parent has to be present during training sessions." If possible, Navasca takes the opportunity to invite the parents to participate in the training sessions.

'Ignite a flame'

Despite his years practicing the techniques, Navasca remains humble as he represents a part of the Filipino culture. "Teaching FMA allows me to continue training in the art through propagation. Even though I teach, I still consider myself a student who just hap-

pened to have studied for 10 years," Navasca said. "It also allows me to spread the culture and the lesser-known history of Filipinos told through FMA."

He pointed out that unlike other tactical sports, like Brazilian jiu-jitsu or judo, the island has yet to have Filipino martial arts as a regularly practiced sport.

"Guam, even though with a fairly sizable Filipino community, doesn't have a strong interest in FMA," Navasca said. "Other countries and also the U.S. have FMA exponentially growing and it's only going to expand even more. I'm hoping that I and other

FMA practitioners can ignite a flame here on Guam to bring the art out of seclusion."

Navasca plans to rebuild the practice of Filipino martial arts on island by first reviving the Filipino martial arts club at the University of Guam. He also wants to raise awareness among his fellow kababayans, "friends" in English, that even Filipinos have their own martial arts that they could practice and be proud to study and defend themselves with.

He also hopes to take his skills to several competitions like the Arnis competitions of the Southeast

Asian Games. With enough fire in him, Navasca wants to hold his own competitions on island. "Yes, I'm looking to one day start a

tournament here on Guam, even if it's just exhibition to show the different systems and styles in FMA," he said.

Navasca leaves those interested in FMA with one point of advice: "You'll never know how far you'll go if you don't take the first step out of your comfort zone. This is exactly what happened to me 10 years ago."
