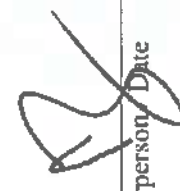

The GBME noted that the following applications were and issued since the last GBME meeting:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Jonathan C. Hays – GRC Michael J. Golden – GRC Samer S. Shuaib – GRMC Shayla B. Nesbitt – Sagua Mañagu Megan Elizabeth G. Klocek – GMHA <p>Dr. Berg informed the GBME that, upon the invitation of the Governor, he will meet with her, but not in the capacity of a GBME member, to discuss the utility of continuing the authority to issue temporary emergency licenses after the declaration of emergency is lifted due to the shortage of physicians. He stated that Dr. David, Asst AG Weinberg and the HPLO Administrator are also expected to attend. Subsequently, and if it is determined there is a value to continue this flexibility of issuing temporary licenses, he would propose that this issue be placed on the GBME agenda, so that the GBME could discuss the matter in open forum, especially since a change in the law would be required. 	<p>4. GBME-CO-2022-003 – Received: 01/24/2022. Dr. Cruz reported that he is awaiting written consent from the physician, which will allow contact with his mental health professional to obtain information on his progress. However, at the time of the meeting, the physician had not yet checked his email. Dr. Berg requested that the physician be reminded of his obligation to keep the GBME apprised of his situation and to reply to GBME requests. Dr. Cruz stated that the physician stated that he would check his mail. In addition, Dr. Cruz stated that the physician provided an update on his court case, which will be held on 5 December 2022 and where he will plead guilty and be placed on probation for two years. According to the plea agreement, if he is in full compliance at the end of probationary period, then the case will be expunged.</p> <p>Dr. Berg stated that is important for the GBME to have more detailed information on the conditions of the plea agreement regarding his recovery, so that the Board could determine if he remains fit to continue medical practice for the safety of the community. Therefore, an update from the mental health professional will be useful information to support the Board's decision.</p> <p>Dr. Cruz inquired about the Board's actions regarding a guilty plea during the probationary period. Dr. Berg stated that the GBME would need to individualize its assessment based on the requirements. For instance, the Board may simply need a monthly update on his progress in treatment and compliance with the conditions of his plea agreement. If he violates his conditions that would interfere with his ability and fitness to provide safe medical care, then that would be a concern of the Board. Since he has a 5-year gap and there are no other jurisdictions that allow licensure after a 5-year gap, he recommends that the applicant complete a recognized re-entry program (e.g., PACE) including a full re-evaluation/assessment before consideration of licensure; this process is recognized by the FSMB. Dr. Berg summarized the complaint stating that a patient complained that a physician did not seriously take her complaint of being exposed to contaminated water, which led to health issues, but also delayed diagnosis, making her and her daughter ineligible from joining a class action lawsuit. GBME is awaiting more detailed information before it could forward the complaint to the physician. For the GBME members to be compliant with the government ethics and its rules and regulations, it would have been inappropriate to discuss these inquiries outside of the GBME meetings.) Dr. Berg stated that the applicant, who was licensed under a separate state medical board, was subject to specific conditions to maintain his license, but was able to relocate to Guam. The state board subsequently agreed to eliminate some of the restrictions; however, the other conditions of the agreement remained in effect until the compliance period ended. The GBME agreed to review the applicant's progress in 6 months' time. To date, the applicant's employer and another physician have provided a positive report. Dr. David stated that the applicant appears to be doing well in his recovery under supervision and appears to be fully compliant with the remaining conditions (e.g., attendance at AA meetings, alcohol and drug screening); therefore, she does not recommend imposing any additional restrictions, provided the applicant remains compliant. In-line with the FSMB, the GBME should be supportive of impaired physicians in their recovery; however, the GBME should be prepared to intervene in the event there are any flags that come before the attention of the Board. Furthermore, she stated that his license will be subject for review next year. Dr. Berg supported the foregoing comments and recommended that the applicant must continue to comply with the requirements imposed by the state board, which will be communicated in writing to the applicant by Dr. Berg. 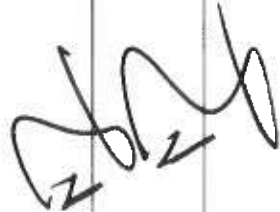

Kevin Durant makes Suns debut

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Kevin Durant made his Phoenix Suns debut Wednesday night against the Charlotte Hornets.

Durant, wearing No. 35, was greeted by a loud ovation as he was introduced at Spectrum Center and fans held up cell phones stretching to get video of him in his white jersey.

He missed a foul line jumper on his team's first possession, but scored his first basket with the Suns a few moments later on a driving left-handed layup. Durant followed with a block on Hornets rookie center Mark Williams

and then knocked down a 3-pointer from the left wing as the Suns bolted to a 9-0 lead.

He is expected to be on a minutes restriction as he makes his way back from a knee injury that has held him out since Jan. 8.

The 13-time All-Star was acquired from the Brooklyn Nets in a blockbuster deal in which the Suns parted ways with Mikal Bridges, Cam Johnson, Jae Crowder and four first-round picks.

Like Durant's previous stops in Seattle, Oklahoma City, Golden State and Brooklyn, the expectations are high — and there is a different level of excitement

learned a long time ago that pressure and expectations are a privilege and you have to embrace those things because that is where the good stuff is."

Williams admitted that anything less than an NBA championship this season would feel like a disappointment, but added that is true of any of the league's top teams.

Durant's has been through plenty during his

ment with his arrival.

"You feel it," Suns coach Monty Williams said. "You feel it at the (team) hotel when people are lined up outside. You feel it in the gym. ... Yeah, I feel it. I

15-year NBA career, but this is the first time he's joined a new team midway through the season.

"I have a lot of experience in the league, so the transition was a little easier than it would have been 10 years ago," Durant said following practice Tuesday. "It's a quick turnaround and everything happened so fast. But the game is the constant thing."

Iditarod begins with smallest field ever

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — The second half-century for the world's most famous sled dog race is getting off to a rough start.

Only 33 mushers will participate in the ceremonial start of the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race on Saturday, the smallest field ever to take their dog teams nearly 1,000 miles over Alaska's unforgiving wilderness. This year's lineup is smaller even than that of the 34 mushers who lined up for the very first race in 1973.

The small pool of mushers is raising concerns about the future of an iconic race that has taken hits from the pandemic, climate change, inflation and the loss of deep-pocketed sponsors, just as multiple big-name mushing champions are retiring with few to take their place.

The largest field ever was 96 mushers in 2008; the average number of mushers starting the race over the last 50 years was 63.

"It's a little scary when you look at it that way," said four-time winner Martin Buser, 64, who retired after completing his 39th race last year. "Hopefully it's not a state of the event and ... it's just a temporary lull."

The Iditarod is the most prestigious sled dog race

in the world, taking competitors over two mountain ranges, the frozen Yukon River and treacherous Bering Sea ice in frigid temperatures before ending in the old Gold Rush town of Nome.

The roughly 10-day event begins with a "ceremonial start" in Anchorage

on Saturday, followed by the competitive start in Willow, about 70 miles to the north, on Sunday.

And while the world-renowned race has the highest winner's purse of any sled dog competition, the winner only pockets about \$50,000 before taxes.
