Rays manager Al Sarmiento said his team is as ready as they will ever be. He's already selected his starter, but declined to name him publicly.

"The Dodgers are a good team, and we are looking forward to a good battle with them," said Sarmiento.

The last time the two teams met in the 2021 regular season, the crowd was huge. Sarmiento said he hopes for more games like it during the 2022 season, now that restrictions on outdoor gatherings have been lifted.

The Dodgers will have many of the same faces, as well as a couple of familiar ones that weren't with the team last year. Sarmiento said that people will no-

tice small lineup changes this season. He expects that many teams will have changed up their rosters, since some teams from last year will not return this year.

"I sure hope we get those crowds again. For one, it's a way to celebrate that those restrictions are no longer in place and for two, it's great motivation for all players to play their best," said Sarmiento. "I would love to see the fans return and cheer like they used to, by the hundreds."

12 teams

This year's season features 12 teams, said Alcantara, and games will take place five nights a week. A Monday night game has been added to the schedule, which means each of the 12 teams will get to play once a week.

Dodgers slugger Mike Bautista, who won the GML Triple Crown in 2013, looks primed to do it again. He's tied with others for the lead in home runs and batting average, and holds sole possession of the RBI lead with 14. He along with many family members joined the Dodgers as a tribute to his uncle Ed Muña, a beloved former GML star who favored the Dodgers.

"What would really make this special is that my uncle Ed was also a Triple Crown winner," said Bautista. "And I believe that Matt Muña won one too, so to have another Triple Crown winner in the family, that to me is a big deal."

In the end, he said, championships trump individual accolades all day every day.

"Those individual awards, yeah, they're nice.

But what it all boils down to is championships. I want to win more games, and I want to win more championships."

Player sues over allegation coach abused her

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) — A tennis player alleges in a lawsuit against the U.S. Tennis Association that the governing body for the sport failed to protect her from a coach who she says sexually abused her at one of its training centers when she was 19.

Kylie McKenzie alleged touched her vagina after a practice in November 2018 at the USTA's training center in Orlando, Florida. Before touching her, Aranda, then 34, told McKenzie she was beautiful and asked questions about her body, according to the lawsuit filed Monday in federal court in central Florida.

In earlier encounters, McKenzie alleges Aranda touched her stomach and waist when talking about her weight, tried to intertwine his arm with her extended arm while she held a phone, and pressed his body against her back side

and grabbed her hips under the guise of instructing her on technique in her serve.

At a news conference in Tempe, Arizona, on Tuesday, McKenzie tearfully told reporters that the sexual abuse had negatively affected her confidence and self-esteem and that the anxiety she felt from the abuse consumed her on the tennis court in 2019 and 2020. "It has been damaging to me as a person and as a player," McKenzie said.

The Associated Press generally doesn't name alleged sexual assault victims, but McKenzie agreed to let her identity be known in news coverage about her lawsuit.

The lawsuit alleges that Aranda, who was employed by USTA for about seven years and later fired, used his position as a USTA coach to get access to vulnerable female athletes and commit sexual battery against them.

In a statement, USTA spokesman Chris Widmaier said USTA and USTA Player Development had no knowledge of harassment or inappropriate conduct by Aranda until McKenzie reported the incident. "USTA and Player Development followed its established procedures in acting swiftly to report the incident and protect and support Ms. McKenzie," Widmaier said.

Efforts to reach Aranda, who wasn't named as a defendant in the lawsuit, for comment through phone calls and emails Tuesday were unsuccessful.

The New York Times has reported that Aranda denied inappropriately touching McKenzie in his testimony during an investigation by the U.S. Center for SafeSport, which examines harassment and other abuse allegations in U.S. sports.

South Carolina beats UConn for NCAA title

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Dawn Staley hoisted the championship trophy high, strutted around the court and stopped for a brief victory dance. She handed over the hardware to South Carolina's student band, then headed back to mid-court for more merriment.

The Gamecocks hit all the right notes this season, and they finished with a masterpiece.

Staley's team buttoned up on defense and dominated on the glass, beating UConn 64-49 on Sunday night to end the Huskies' undefeated streak in title games. Destanni Henderson scored a career-high 26 points, Aliyah Boston added 11 points and 16 rebounds, and the Gamecocks handed Geno Auriemma's Huskies their first loss in 12 NCAA title games.

"We played every pos-

session like it was our last possession," said Staley, the first Black men's or women's coach with two Division I titles. "They were determined to be champions today."

Last year's loss

A year ago, South Carolina lost in the Final Four

when Boston missed a layup before the buzzer.

"Honestly, I've been thinking about this since last season. Everyone had a picture of me crying," said Boston, who was the Most Outstanding Player of the Final Four. "Today, we're national champions and I'm in tears."


