Generations

Martinez also noted that the tradition to play for the

alumni tournaments passes through generations. He and Anderson had sons competing in the tournament the same day.

"Everybody just wants to come out," Martinez said.

He didn't just think it was due to family tradition, but the brotherhood and the camaraderie that the school instilled.

"It's something; the brotherhood is there. Whatever we do out here is reflected to the other brotherhoods that are younger than we are, and we want them to carry that forward," he said. "It's a tradition and we're proud to be a part of that."

The tradition also will

expand in an upcoming event.

"Because of our number of years since we graduated, we have developed our boys, our younger kids, that went to school here," Martinez said. "So, we developed the father, son and grandson tournament."

Martinez said the event will have one game set aside for the father, son and grandson tournament.

"We took our team, the guys that we have, and we split it in half," Martinez said.

The father, son and grandson tournament is set for July 6, 2022 Summer Basketball Tourney.

the best of the best volleyball players that represented the U.S. in the 2004 and 2008 Olympics and during tournaments overseas.

Taitano said that Salmon wasn't just his coach, but an overall mentor for him as he was developing his volleyball skills. "He cares for the team so much," Taitano said. "He would work us, but it was good for us, we needed that. He put the team together, he was very big about team and we appreciate that." Taitano said that under Salmon's

guidance, everyone shined equally, no matter if there was a star player.

Another quality Taitano admired from Salmon was his continued drive. "He still has the drive to work-out. Like after I was done playing, we would do cardio at 5 a.m. and he likes that, and I was so not for it. I told him like six or seven... we compromised." Taitano said. Salmon never allowed Taitano to throw in the towel, even when Taitano was contemplating to stop playing volleyball. Salmon quickly introduced Taitano to his fellow Olympian volleyball player David Lee. From college coaches and Olympians, Taitano

was given more time to do a lot better with his volleyball skills and the access to guidance that he currently passes on to younger volleyball players.

Taitano now coaches the 12s, 14s and the 15s boys and girls teams while bouncing around the net to help the 16s, 17s and 18s boys and girls teams. Taitano says he likes coaching the younger teams as he tends to look back at what he's learned throughout the years and what he would be able to share with his younger players.

He also added that he keeps in touch with his previous coaches, even recently seeing them during a

volleyball game in Orlando, Florida. "I'm so appreciative of the choices I've had in my past," Taitano said. "These kids are going to go through so many coaches, but the ones that were hard and to message your coach that you haven't seen in forever...it's amazing. That's why I want to be part of the younger kids, the 12s, 13s and 14s, so I can be a part of their volleyball journey and help them be the best."

Taitano said that his coaching style is an amalgam of Charette and Salmon depending on what team he's working with. "I see so much potential in people, like there's a kid that can be like the worse player in the

gym, but underneath it all, he enjoys the sport that you know has potential," Taitano said. "But I am hard on the kids that want to work very hard. There are kids who want to learn, want to get better...they just get excited."

Taitano's future plan is playing for Guam's national volleyball team. "Oh my gosh, yes...I want to play so bad," Taitano said. "I want to represent my island, I want to...that's a for sure thing."

In 2016, she was selected to Guam's U14 Girls National Team that traveled to China for the AFC U14 Girls Regional Championship East Region in Beijing. The following year, Lopez was selected for Guam's U15 Girls National Team that competed at the EAFF U15 Girls Tournament in Shanghai.

In 2018, Lopez was called up to Guam's U16 Women's National Team to compete in the AFC U16 Women's Championship Qualifier in Sri Lanka, starting in all of Guam's four matches. The following year, she traveled to Hong Kong with Guam's U17 Women's National Team for the Jockey Club Girls' International Youth Invitational Football Tournament. Lopez also played in the 2019 Marianas Cup U19 Women's competition.

Though the COVID-19 pandemic halted international competition for most of 2020, Lopez was called up to a Guam U20 Women's National Team training camp at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center in July 2021.

Following her performance at the training camp, Ross Awa, interim Head Coach of the Masakáda, Guam Women's National Team, in 2021 placed Lopez on Guam's preliminary registration for the AFC Women's Asian Cup Qualifiers. Awa was also the Head Coach of the Guam U20 Women's National Team in 2021.

"Yasmeen has a winner's mentality and I can guarantee that is something she will display with Hesston College," said Awa, who will officially take over as Masakáda

Head Coach later this month. "Her game intelligence within the midfield has made her a consistent player on the pitch and has provided us with a lot of support offensively and defensively in key moments of the game. Yasmeen has grit and will always compete for the ball."

Lopez was offered a scholarship to Hesston College after she was spotted by college coaches on the NCSA recruiting platform. Hesston College competes in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference of the National Junior College Athletic Association.

Domestically, Lopez most recently played for the Bank of Guam Lady Strykers in the Bud Light Women's Soccer League Premier Division. Lopez also played for Quality Distributors FC in the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League.

Lopez will depart Guam the first week of August and plans to major in criminal justice.
