Kennedy High School Islanders and founder of the API, now in its 17th year. Locally, the Islanders took the boys and girls cross-country titles at the All-Island meet held Monday at JFK.

Each participating school can have up to seven runners each for the boys and girls races. The first five finishers can score points — a runner's placing determines the points scored — while the other two runners act as pushers. A pusher cannot score, but they can fill in a spot otherwise taken by a scoring runner.

Guam's teams will have some familiarity with the course, as JFK's Ramsey Field was also the site for the All-Island meet, but that's about as much advantage as they will get. Antonio and his crew have been busy over the last weeks, and have lined the entire

5K course with hundreds of coconuts.

Runners from Guam, Korea and Palau will have to contend with runners from The American School in Japan Mustangs, which have won every team trophy since the first race almost two decades ago. The race is held over two days with the first being the 5K, scheduled for 4:30 p.m. Friday. The second race is a coed relay held 6 a.m. Saturday at Ypao Beach. A champion is determined by a school's placing in the boys and girls 5K plus Saturday's relay.

The event also recognizes and awards the top 15 overall runners in each gender division.

Return

The API XC has become so popular over the years, that one off-island league has used it as their season finale. While there are 16 schools entered for 2022, Antonio said there were as many as 31 schools competing in the past. This year's race will be the first one since late 2019 prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Besides the local public school entries and Guam Adventist Academy, the Academy of Our Lady of Guam, the Guam High Panthers and the St. John's Knights will also compete. The Independent Interscholastic Athletic Association of Guam's schools moved cross-country to the second quarter on the sports schedule, so the API XC will be a warmup for their season, said Antonio.

And while the Saturday relay is critical to a team's overall ranking in the event, the fact that it's held at the beach brings out more than just the competitive runner in each athlete.

"Everybody becomes a kid again at the relay," said Antonio

The public is invited to watch and admission is free. Spectators can bring chairs and umbrellas and cheer on their favorite athletes, said Antonio.

"It's definitely gonna be fun," he said.

	ii. Dr. Wielaard stated that GMRC is offering to equip emergency transports with glucometers, as the readings are part of the assessment to determine if a patient is showing signs of a stroke. The Chair welcomed the offer and requested that dissemination of the glucometers be coordinated with D. Burrier, who stated that GFD personnel are trained in using this device. It is important to ensure EMS personnel are trained. Dr. von Trampe also stated that Dr. Shay is offering refresher training on stroke recognition for emergency personnel. D. Burrier welcomed the offer and suggested that this training count for CEUs for recertification. In addition, the Chair suggested that training could also be open to all paramedics and included in GCCs curriculum. The Chair expressed his appreciation to GMRC. The EMSC noted an increase of diversions for the past couple of months at GMHA, GMRC and USNH. D. Burrier reported one diversion case where there was a delay upon arrival; however, after discussion with the Charge Nurse and the ER physician a bed was eventually made available. Some issues the EMSC should address are: Better communications between dispatch and hospitals on emergency room bed space prior to arrival. b. Consider need to establish another category of diversion, e.g., better coordination when saturation levels are reaching capacity, possibility of increasing number of receivables at the same location when saturation levels dictate; etc. c. Working with emergency dispatch centers on staging and queue based on saturation levels 3. Dr. Mendiola stated that he would discuss the above with the GMRC Medical Director with the aim to improve communications when diverting patients and medical care is delayed due high saturation levels and to help minimize conflict between hospital personnel and emergency dispatch personnel during these periods that may sometimes lead to other problems, such as poor bed-side manner, misunderstanding, etc. M, Guayco requested for him to be informed immediately should there be any is	DECISION(S) / ACTION(S) MADE
