2 former Pizza Hut workers must repay \$17K in theft case but they're not going to prison

Two women arrested for their part in a scheme to steal money from a restaurant by deleting thousands of dollars worth of transactions admitted their guilt in the Superior Court of Guam.

Victoria Jessmarina Meno Santiago and Jhimelina Magan appeared virtually before Judge Arthur Barcinas on Tuesday.

The pair signed a deferred plea that charges them each with aggregated theft of property as third-degree felonies. A deferred plea means the defendants could have their case expunged if they successfully complete the terms of their probation.

Both faced up to three years in prison but were spared from having to serve any additional jail time and were placed on probation.

It was said in court that Magan has

since relocated to Colorado where she would have to check in with probation.

Restitution in the case was set at about \$17,866.

In August 2019, the women were arrested.

The scheme unraveled when Pizza Hut corporate office noticed the restaurant had lost about \$5,700 in five days. An audit of the five-day period showed numerous orders had been deleted and changed to 75-cent orders for pizza sauce.

When asked why there were so many ticket changes and orders that were deleted, the assistant managers allegedly said the customers changed their minds and only wanted the sauce.

A more complete audit revealed orders worth more than \$50,000 had been deleted and changed by the three employees. The third employee's name was not available.

Santiago told authorities that she made 343 ticket changes and deleted order transactions totaling \$15,850 in four months.

Teen who escaped from DYA captured

A teenager accused in a gas station robbery escaped from the Department of Youth Affairs custody over the weekend and was on the run for about two days before being captured by police.

Zivon Choffat, 18, got out of the Mangilao facility around 3:16 p.m. on Sunday, according to Guam Police Department spokesperson Officer Berlyn Savella.

Detectives with GPD's Juvenile Investigations Section followed up on information that led them to the Yigo area where the teen was

located on Tuesday.

Choffat was 17 at the time of his initial arrest. He has been moved to the Department of Corrections jail now that he's an adult.

An internal affairs investigation is underway at DYA to determine how he escaped.

Crime

In mid-February, Choffat and Tommy Amanto, 19, were arrested after being accused of robbing a gas station in Yigo at knife point and getting away with cash, tobacco products and \$450 worth of beer.

Choffat brandished a small knife and threatened a gas station cashier with the words: "Don't call the police, I'm going to kill you," the prosecution stated in court documents.

Dededo shooting suspect held on \$25K bail

A witness allegedly told police that the victim said, "I got shot by Jerome," following a fight in Dededo last month that sent the victim to the hospital.

Defendant Jerome Camacho Cruz, 37, was charged with attempted murder as a first-degree felony, possession of a firearm without a firearm identification card as a third-degree felony, and other charges.

Cruz is being held at the Department of Corrections on \$25,000 cash bail.

The shooting was reported at Adelfa Court in Dededo on Feb. 20.

The victim told police that the suspect came to his residence and began arguing about an item that he

claimed the victim stole from him, court documents state.

The victim turned away and then realized he had been shot in the abdomen, documents state.

Cruz was on house arrest for a 2021 illegal drug possession and illegal gun possession case at the time of his recent arrest.

US gasoline prices edge lower after hitting record high last week

NEW YORK (Reuters) - U.S. gasoline prices at the pump edged lower over the weekend after reaching all-time highs last week following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Retail gasoline prices fell for the second straight day on Sunday to \$4.325 per gallon, below a record of \$4.331 hit on Friday, according to American Automobile Association data. Russia's invasion of Ukraine in late February has roiled energy markets worldwide since, bringing more expensive fuel costs to motorists who have also been hit by higher inflation.

Oil markets have been volatile recently. Global benchmark Brent crude futures rose to \$139.13 per barrel last Monday, the highest since 2008. They then plummeted to as low as \$105.60 per barrel on Wednesday.

"It appears for now that retail prices have caught up to the rise and oil and are now falling on the big drop in oil that occurred on Wednesday and Thursday," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis at GasBuddy.

"However, there may be slight increases down the road if oil prices edge higher."

Analysts consider \$4 a gallon to be a psychological trigger for consumers filling up at the pump that results in cost considerations for motorists.

Former president Barack Obama tests positive for coronavirus

(The Washington Post) - Former president Barack Obama said Sunday he has tested positive for the coronavirus, noting that his symptoms appeared mild so far.

"I just tested positive for COVID," Obama said on Twitter. "I've had a scratchy throat for a couple days, but am feeling fine otherwise. Michelle and I are grateful to be vaccinated and boosted, and she has tested negative."

"It's a reminder to get vaccinated if you haven't already, even as cases go down," he added.

Coronavirus cases in the United States have fallen to their lowest levels

since last July, but more than 9,000 Americans per week continue to die of COVID-19, the disease caused by the coronavirus, according to data tracked by The Washington Post. Nearly 1 million people in the United States have died of the coronavirus since the beginning of the pandemic.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released new guidance this month that eased recommendations on mask-wearing for people in parts of the United States with low coronavirus transmission rates. Some have criticized the agency's decision, arguing that the omicron and other variants of the coronavirus are highly transmissible, while noting that the elderly, immunocompromised people and those still ineligible for vaccination remain at risk.
