"On the first couple of throws, I was trying to drive my hips forward to have more power, but it didn't work for me. On my last throw, I just tried to power it through with my arms," he said. "I honestly didn't think it was far enough."

His final throw wasn't as far as he had tossed on Guam with a heavier javelin and it was also only about half of the gold-medal throw of 61 meters. But it inspired him to give the

javelin more attention when he enters his junior year at John E. Kennedy High in the fall.

"I'd like to get the high school record before I graduate," he said. The record of 46 meters was set two track seasons ago by Travon Jacobs.

Valdez also finished the 1,500-meter run Tuesday, coming in ninth out of nine runners. He was scheduled to run the 800 meters Wednesday.

Guam's own Dan Muñoz won the men's overall bodybuilding championship during the International Federation of Bodybuilding Pro League/National Physique Committee Championship Saturday in northern California.

The event was held in

Sacramento where Muñoz took the top spot in the division.

Muñoz said that he enters every show he competes with fresh eyes since each show is unique in its own way. "I really didn't know what to expect going into the show, but staying focused on my original plan and goals helped me to achieve success in this competition," Muñoz said.

Muñoz previously competed during the IFBB's North American Championship in Sept. 2017 in Pittsburgh. He finished

in fifth place out of 13 in the Masters over-35 Light Heavyweight division, according to PDN files.

Muñoz has come a long way since, taking the overall medal. He also took the time to thank his family, friends, supporters and coach for keeping him motivated throughout the process.

He then said that he's not ruling out another competition. "Yes, you will definitely see me compete elsewhere later this year," Muñoz said.
