The Geckos avoided the shutout. Just two minutes into the second half, Deztinie Ogo scored a goal to make it 4-1. Han got her hat trick with about 14 minutes left in regulation. She celebrated with an aerial body bump with sophomore Halili.

The Geckos appeared to have plenty of fun regardless of score. Teammates cheered on Geckos fullback Soreenacestine "Reena" Olpindo every time the ball came her way. She wasn't the fastest player on the field but she was definitely strong, and a few opponents hit the ground battling her for the ball. "Ayyyyy! In every sport, that's just how it is," she said, laughing. "I'm always bigger than the other person, and I can't always feel bad.

Afterthoughts

"I felt really good, like I haven't played soccer in a really long time. This is my second high school soccer game and I felt really excited," said Han, a junior. "I think my team played really well and our chemistry is getting there, but I feel that our communication and our first touch definitely needs work but I feel like we'll get there by playoffs."

But after, I'll always say, 'Hey, are you OK?' But not in that moment, because the adrenaline is rushing. It's not intentional, you know. Big body, you gotta play big."

Olpindo was also the backbone for the Geckos basketball team and could easily score half her team's points.

Even as the Islanders build on their undefeated record and look for a three-peat as two-time defending champs, they also want to stay connected during the off season. They are losing just four seniors, and the team's main scorers are underclassmen.

"We'll have a lot of players coming back next year," said Han.

os' Nathan Castro, Tiyan High Titans' Dean Masnayan and hurdler Moises Manalo from the Simon Sanchez High Sharks are in the mix in the sprints.

Panthers' Alex Rink barely edged teammate Jayden Jackson in the 400-meter, and both set personal bests running in under 58 seconds.

Galvez

Sharks' Teo Galvez won both the 800 and 1,500-meter events with personal bests: 2 minutes, 70 seconds in the 800 and 4 minutes, 40.58 seconds in the mile. He thanked GW's Alexander Clark for pushing him in the longer run. Galvez led his heat from the start and through the finish.

The latter event also welcomed the return of Southern High Dolphins' Danny Quinata, who will contend in anything he races in up to the All-Island.

Hugh Kent blistered the field with a 9 minute, 50.04 time in the 3,000 meter, giving himself more than half a minute to grab some water and turn around to see teammates Mark Imazu and Landon Taitingfong run a 10 minute, 22 second and a 10 minute, 46 second, respectively.

Panther's Cameron Brantley still owns both hurdle events. Geckos' Jacob Jackson is showing promise in both hurdles too, setting a PR in the 110-meter at 18.55 seconds, and finishing third in the 300-meter at 47.41 seconds.

The Geckos is still somewhat in striking distance in the 4X100-meter relay to the Panthers, which basically can be any four of their six or so sprinters, provided there's a Johnson or Gallego on the squad.

The same goes for the 4X400 relay, which now includes middle distance specialist Rink.

Dolphins' Jhavin Maniebo is destined for the podium with his success at the implements. He threw almost 13 meters in the shot put, 31.79 meters in the discus and set a personal best, good for fifth place in the javelin. Zian Benavente of the John F. Kennedy Islanders placed third in the shot but took two second-place finishes in the discus and javelin. Carlos Poppe from the Guam Adventist Academy Angels is also part of the elite cluster in the throws, and competition is fierce in the jav, where Mark Imazu elbowed his way to the top spot, followed by teammates Benavente and Valdez.

Jared Aguon still owns the jumps, with other schools inching their way closer.

Girls division

In the girls division, Shark's Erica Palisoc was a breath away from cracking her personal best in the 200-meter sprint, duplicating her best run with a 29.09 second race. She demolished her personal best in the 100-meter sprint, going from a 14.06 prior to Friday to a blistering 13.87 run. It was also a smidge ahead of the Panthers' speedsters Kailee Guerrero, who ran a 13.88 seconds, and Amoni Washington, who ran a 14.21 seconds.

"I felt very amazing," said the 16-year-old sophomore from Simon Sanchez. "Kailee, ever since middle school I've finished behind her. She motivates and inspires me very much."

Aleah Castro led in the 200-meter, running 28.99 seconds, while Palisoc finished second and Guerrero finished third. Academy of Our Lady of Guam Cou-

gars' Tylor-Ann Santos finished at 29.81 seconds.

Castro also won the 400-meter, finishing in 1 minute, 6.44 seconds, and Geckos' Jordan Baden also set a PR in the 800 with a 2 minute, 35.93 second finish — well ahead of a trio of Panthers in Molly Lang, Sophia Fernandez and Keira Paz.

Lang ruled the mile with a 6 minute, 5.90 second time, and Castro won the sprint hurdles. Panthers' Ciri Hawkins won the intermediate hurdles, and the Panthers and Geckos split wins in the relays. Panthers clocked a 54.51 second in the one-lap relay and the

Geckos clocked in at 4 minutes, 43.58 seconds in the 4X400-meter.

Islanders' Maria Calvo is still the jumper to beat, as she had a convincing win in the long jump but was dominant in the triple jump, about a meter and half past the next best jumper, teammate Chasti-

ty Minor who jumped 8.27 meters.

The final qualification meet and the last chance athletes will have to rank in the top 12 in their event will be May 9. Only the top 12 will qualify for the All-Island meet, scheduled for May 16 at John F. Kennedy High.
