IV	<p>Z. Pecina provided the Administrators' report, starting with an update on upcoming events. She mentioned that the annual conference will take place from October 10th to 14th, and both she and B. Sablan will attend to fulfill certain responsibilities, including meetings with the executive team about remote testing and the organization's gold membership. The agreement for remote testing has been signed and will be implemented, and the gold membership with NIC has been successfully acquired and paid for.</p> <p>The report highlighted the importance of establishing a model practice act in coordination with NIC. Z. Pecina plans to expedite the preparation of rules and regulations for the Board. It was noted that most other boards have adopted this standard, which is recognized nationally and ensures consistency across states. The goal is to implement similar standards for Barbering and Cosmetology, with the intent to finalize all rules and regulations by the end of August so they can be presented to the legislature for approval.</p>		HPLO	0914	Noted

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	<p>During the meeting, it was confirmed that there are three disciplinary cases under consideration, with two already assigned. A. Taitano clarified that a new case has not yet been assigned. Z. Pecina emphasized the importance of following the established disciplinary process, noting that this procedure will help determine if outside legal counsel is necessary. She mentioned that a new legal counsel, Attorney Strader, has been appointed to assist the Board with cases related to cosmetology and barbering. She encouraged the Board members to seek assistance if needed and reiterated that unresolved cases may require further discussion to determine if they should be referred outside the Board.</p> <p>The discussion turned to the Board composition, with the Z. Pecina noting that the Board currently lacks a youth member. The Governor's office is aware of the situation, and while a youth member had previously been nominated, they rescinded their nomination. The Board is hopeful that a new youth member will be appointed soon. The speaker then opened the floor to B. Sablan for any additional comments.</p> <p>B. Sablan provided a brief update to the Board, informing them that Z. Pecina has signed a contract with the approved vendor from NIC to administer remote testing, which will take effect on October 1. The transition period was set to allow applicants to adjust, and during this time, both remote testing and the traditional paper-and-pencil option will be available, as some applicants may prefer the latter. The Board will offer five initial testing stations, with plans to increase that number, and the examinations will be conducted in a controlled setting for security reasons, specifically in another office at T-11. The exams will be available from Tuesday to Friday. B. Sablan emphasized that as the launch date approaches, Board members will be involved to ensure everyone is aligned and informed. She also highlighted that while remote testing fees are higher than those for written theory and practicals, both options will remain available. Additionally, training will be provided to A. Taitano, M. Tiong, and J. Blas, as their contact information has been shared with the vendor.</p> <p>B. Sablan further explained that with the contract now signed, training will be provided to Board members, including M. Tiong, whose previous certification has expired, and R. Santos. She emphasized the importance of completing this training before the next Board meeting to ensure readiness for the October deadline next year. Z. Pecina added that while this year's training will be conducted virtually, there are plans for in-person training next year, allowing Board members to meet their contacts and familiarize themselves with the contractors they will be working with.</p>

Stay Fresh Academy</p> <p>Daniel Gurwell, representing Stay Fresh Academy, reported that three students have already completed their program, and one remaining student is expected to finish by October 31. A. Taitano noted that the purpose of the discussion is to consider an extension to allow this final student to complete the program.</p> <p>Reynaldo Tingson inquired if the extension is limited to October 31. A. Taitano confirmed this, explaining that Stay Fresh Academy needs to attend the conference in September. Mr. Tingson mentioned that he is already booked for the conference in Las Vegas, scheduled for the next month, and has incurred significant expenses to attend. A. Taitano acknowledged this but clarified that, in the last meeting, it was communicated that Stay Fresh was not planning to participate in the September conference. Attendance at this conference was a requirement for extending the establishment license, which is necessary for their next step towards accreditation. The extension is therefore being granted in consideration of the final student currently enrolled at the academy. Mr. Tingson expressed that he has several students who will be enrolled soon and that he is currently at the conference in Las Vegas, which he has already paid a significant amount to attend. He offered to provide receipts as proof of his expenses. In response, it was pointed out that at previous meetings, it was indicated that Stay Fresh Academy might be closing due to lack of enrollment, raising concerns about the purpose of attending the conference if the school were to close.</p>			Unanimously Approved Extension of Establishment License until 31 Oct 2024

	<p>Mr. Tingson clarified that although there might be a misunderstanding, the school is not closing but might not be accepting new students at the moment. He assured that the establishment is still operational and will maintain its applicant status. It was noted that, according to NACUS, at least one student is required to maintain active applicant status. Mr. Tingson confirmed that he has one student currently and can enroll additional students if necessary.</p> <p>The discussion concluded with a recognition of the information Mr. Tingson provided and an acknowledgment that further discussion is needed between him and Daniel, as the current information seems inconsistent with what had been previously reported.</p> <p>A. Taitano indicated that the current focus is on extending the establishment license to accommodate the last enrolled student. She noted that the extension does not address the broader issue of accreditation but will allow Mr. Tingson to attend the conference. Any additional information or documents provided later will be considered to ensure the school's continued operation and valid establishment license.</p> <p>Mr. Tingson expressed his frustration, emphasizing that as the owner of the school, he needs to be heard and that the Board should consider the financial difficulties associated with accreditation. He requested understanding and support from the Board, highlighting the challenges he faces.</p> <p>A. Taitano acknowledged the financial strain and reiterated that the Board is considering the new information provided by Mr. Tingson. 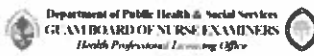
