Guam student represents island at 2025 Young People's Continental Congress in Philadelphia

Kobe Miyashita, a student from Father Dueñas Memorial School, represented the island at the 2025 Young People's Continental Congress.

The application process for this national program required a team of one teacher and one 10th- or 11th-grade student to submit a joint application by Nov. 1, 2024. Applications included a teacher résumé, interest statements from both the teacher and student, an explanation for the student's selection, a teacher peer reference, and a parent/guardian permission form—all compiled into a single PDF. Accepted teams were notified by Dec. 9, 2024, and committed to an online civic education program from January to June 2025, followed by an in-person summit in Philadelphia.

The YPCC program officially began in January 2025 with virtual readings, discussions, and webinars that brought students together online to explore the founding era. It concluded with a week-long, in-person summit from July 14-18, where 27 students from across the United States and its territories gathered to connect, collaborate, and deepen their understanding of American history and civic life.

Throughout the program, Miyashita engaged in historical readings, online discussions, and virtual seminars that offered deep insight into key moments in U.S. history, such as the Boston Massacre, the American Revolutionary War, and the Civil War.

"The program has not only deepened my understanding of the founding of the country but also al-

One of the most memorable experiences was participating in interviews with ABC News and other media outlets and handling original historical documents, including the first handwritten draft of Pennsylvania's Constitution of

"It made me want to share what I've learned with my classmates back home and helped me recognize the significance of the Declaration of Independence and its lasting impact on our nation," Miyashita said. "I now feel more confident using my voice to educate others about our history and encourage civic engagement."

He represented Guam alongside Brian Galang, a Father Dueñas Memorial School teacher of AP World History.

Reflecting on the experience, Galang shared, "The whole YPCC program was not only exciting but enriching. It has given me, us, a better perspective of our nation's founding, journey, and establishment. To a great extent, this will 'revolutionize' the way I will teach the history of our nation. As it takes a village to raise an individual, it takes a nation to raise great citi-

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

However, there is an intention to hold the conference before the end of 2025, with a tentative plan to schedule it in December pending successful approval of the bid. The EMS grant, which renewed on April 1, 2025, included requests from the Guam Fire Department and GMHA for medical equipment and supplies. While some items were procured during the last grant cycle, not all requests were fulfilled. Arrangements are being made to coordinate delivery of the procured equipment to the respective agencies. Ambulance inspections continue regularly, including recent inspections of three GMHA ambulances and others for non-emergency medical transport providers. Acknowledging the ongoing supply shortages and procurement delays, the board was informed that delivery arrangements will be made soon to address agency needs.
