fore being matched for internal medicine at the prestigious hospital.

After four years of college and another four years of medical school with three years of residency to go, Akimoto reflects on his journey towards being a doctor

“The biggest message I want to convey: At every stage of this journey, there have been some tough challenges,” Akimoto said. “What kept me going was the motivation to prove to other local kids that our island has the passion and the work ethic to take them wherever they want to go, so long as they keep our people in their heart and are willing to work towards giving back when they are called to do so.”

With 2029 the target to complete his residency, Akimoto said he’s “trying to get back to Guam as quickly as possible, but make the most impact in
