### Second half

Looking to get on the score board, the Cougars came out aggressive in the second half by attempting to capitalize on every possession.

Although they were able to gain some positive yards, the Royals' defense proved to be too dominant.

Sophomore Kayla McIntosh and Senior Aveyani Babauta led the defensive effort with several key tackles that stopped many of the Cougars' attempts to advance offensively.

Despite a scoreless second half, the Royals maintained control throughout and held off all scoring attempts from the Cougars, securing the 10-0 victory
