Robbie Webber Youth League continues to empower Guam's young footballers

The Guam Football Association, in partnership with Triple J Auto Group, continues to strengthen youth development across the island through the Robbie Webber Youth League—one of Guam's premier grassroots football programs dedicated to nurturing the next generation of athletes.

Designed to promote, foster, and develop youth football for all of Guam, the Robbie Webber Youth League provides boys and girls ages 6 to 17 with opportunities to learn the game, build confidence, and develop teamwork both on and off the field,

GFA said in a media release.

The league operates two seasons each year—Spring (February to April) and Fall (September to December)—giving young players consistent opportunities to compete, grow their skills, and experience the excitement of organized football.

Youth athletes participate across multiple divisions including Under 6, Under 8, Under 11, Under 14, and Under 17 categories, allowing players to develop alongside peers at similar stages of their football journey.

Beyond competition, the Robbie Webber Youth League plays a critical

more than just a game—it's seeing my daughters develop character, confidence, and a love for something that brings them joy."

Players themselves echo that sentiment. "What I love about playing football is making new friends and having fun at the same time," said Dylan Arceo, a U14 player with the Tumon Typhoons. "It has helped build my confidence and I appreciate the support I get from my teammates."

From a development standpoint, the league remains a cornerstone of Guam's football future.

"As sport continues to grow within our region, it's important for the entire football community to be engaged in competition," said Tumon Typhoons head coach Brandon Sana of the U17 Girls team. "The RWYL league is an absolutely critical component in ensuring the growth of the sport. Thousands of youth athletes, whether recreational or competitive, develop through this playing opportunity. Football will soon be the number one sport in our region, and the RWYL is a major reason for that. Thank you Triple J Auto Group RWYL, and have a great season footballers."

role in developing Guam's football community. The program also supports coaching and referee development pathways, providing opportunities for youth and adults to pursue certifications and training that strengthen the island's football ecosystem, GFA said.

All matches are held at the Guam Football Association National Training Center in Harmon, where multiple fields allow games from different divisions to take place throughout the day, creating a vibrant and family-friendly environment for supporters to cheer on Guam's young athletes.

Interest in youth football continues to grow. For the Spring 2026 season alone, 1,366 players have registered to participate in the Robbie Webber Youth League, reflecting the strong enthusiasm among Guam's youth and families

for the sport.

Inspection</p> <p>The Board discussed the need to formally vote on whether to proceed with inspections of optometry clinics, noting that sample letters from prior inspections conducted many years ago had been provided to inform newer members of past practices. It was confirmed that the materials had been distributed and reviewed, with no significant questions raised. The discussion outlined procedures such as providing advance notice to clinics, determining the timeline and logistics for conducting inspections, conducting in pairs, and coordinating visits to minimize disruption to patient care while ensuring proper review of records and required equipment.</p> <p>Clarification was sought regarding specific equipment requirements listed in the governing law, including the interpretation of terms such as ophthalmoscope and keratometer, and whether modern equivalents like autorefractors could satisfy those requirements. It was explained that while the law specifies minimum equipment standards, inspectors could document equivalent devices and later determine their acceptability. The Board also acknowledged that some clinics may not meet all minimum requirements, and in the absence of defined penalties in current law, the approach would involve notifying clinics of deficiencies, allowing reasonable time for correction, and conducting follow-up inspections.</p> <p>Further discussion emphasized the importance of consistency and fairness in enforcement, particularly given historical gaps in conducting inspections and changes in practice standards. The Board considered the process for issuing initial notification letters to all optometrists, informing them of upcoming inspections without specifying exact dates, followed by subsequent scheduling notices. It was noted that a comprehensive list of clinic locations would be needed, including multiple practice sites where applicable, to ensure all facilities are inspected. S. Manibusan would put the list together.</p> <p>The discussion concluded with a formal motion to proceed with inspections of all optometry clinics, including verification of mandatory equipment and documentation requirements. <i>Motion to Approve: J.
