Her success sends a clear message that with the right mindset, work ethic, and support system, athletes from Guam can compete and win on the world’s biggest stages, the academy added.

As Carbs Jiu-Jitsu Guam celebrates this landmark achievement, the academy also recognizes that this is only the beginning of Adamos’ journey.

“Her future remains exceptionally bright, and her accomplishments will continue to inspire athletes throughout Guam, Micronesia, and the Pacific region for years to come,” Carbs Jiu-Jitsu Guam said.

“This championship is more than a victory for one athlete. It is a victory for Guam, for the local jiu-jitsu community, and for every young person who dares to dream beyond the limits others place before them,” the academy added.

The tournament also provides an opportunity for young girls across Guam to witness women’s football at the international level and see a pathway for their own future in the sport, GFA said.

“I hope they see that their

dreams are possible,” Cruz said. “Most importantly, I hope they see people who look like them representing Guam and realize that one day they can be on this field too if they continue to work hard and believe in themselves.”

With a place in the next EAFF E-1 Championship at stake, Team Masakāda understands the significance of the competition and the opportunity to continue elevating women’s football in

Guam, GFA said.

Admission to all matches will be by donation, with proceeds supporting the Northern Mariana Islands Football Association. Spectators are reminded that outside food and drinks, coolers, and chairs are not permitted inside the venue.

The Guam Football Association encourages fans across the island to fill the stands and support Team Masakāda as they begin their journey toward the EAFF E-1 Championship.
