Fix in Six Announces Early Action for Long-Term Recovery; GHURA Kicks Off Community Outreach for CDBG-DR Funded Programs

The Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA) is proud to announce the early launch of the Guam Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) "Fix in Six" program. Originally scheduled to begin in January 2026, GHURA has accelerated the rollout, marking a significant step forward in Guam's recovery from Typhoon Mawar.

September public outreach events:

- **Tuesday, September 30, 6PM - 7PM, Guam Museum Theater**

These outreach efforts will introduce potential applicants to eligibility criteria, including project feasibility, to help the community prepare for the application process. Outreach will continue through December with sessions offered during weekdays, evenings, and weekends, to allow wide community participation.

"Our community has endured tremendous challenges over the last five years. Covid-19 crippled our economy and Typhoon Mawar further devastated our infrastructure and homes," said GHURA Deputy Director Fernando B. Esteves. *"The programs under Fix in Six are long-term solutions that will help our community rebuild stronger than ever before, enhancing resilience, safety, and quality of life for all Guam residents."*

GHURA also announces the launch of a new email address. Community members may reach the program directly at fixinsix@ghura.org. This update ensures easier recall and a clear connection to the agency.

CDBG-DR funds are provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to support long-term recovery efforts in communities affected by natural disasters. In January 2025, GHURA was designated to manage \$500.8 million dollars in CDBG-DR funds to help low- to moderate-income (LMI) households recover from Typhoon Mawar. Over the next six years, Fix in Six will help LMI communities by supporting affordable housing, improving public infrastructure, creating economic opportunities, and strengthening mitigation efforts.
