Fix in Six Announces November Outreach Events

Potential applicants required to attend at least one CDBG-DR outreach for technical assistance

The Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA) invites the community to take part in a series of public outreach events this November as part of the Guam Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Fix in Six Program. These events are designed to arm potential applicants with the knowledge and tools needed to prepare for upcoming program application periods.

November public outreach events:

- **Wednesday, November 5, 6PM - 8PM, Guam Museum Theater (presentation and Q + A session)**
- **Saturday, November 15, 12PM - 2PM, Guam Premier Outlets (informational material distribution)**

Participation in at least one outreach event is required for potential applicants seeking one-on-one technical assistance. However, this requirement does not apply to potential housing program applicants who will be assisted individually through the CDBG-DR Housing Program.

These outreach efforts will guide attendees to understand eligibility requirements, project feasibility, and documentation needed to prepare for the application process. Each outreach is an opportunity to ask questions, engage with Fix in Six representatives, and take the next step toward building resilience.

“The \$500.8 million dollars in disaster recovery funds represents more than just an investment in infrastructure. It’s an investment in our people and our future,” said GHURA Deputy Director and Grant Manager Fernando Esteves. *“These funds will help us build safer, more affordable homes, strengthen public buildings and systems to better serve our community, and spark the economic resurgence our island needs to thrive. The next six years will demand dedication and collaboration from all of us. Rebuilding our island’s resilience is no easy task, but together we will thrive.”*

GHURA also continues to gather feedback through a series of short surveys, available online at guamcdbgdr.org. Residents are encouraged to complete these surveys to help GHURA better understand community needs and priorities in preparation of the upcoming application periods.

CDBG-DR funds are provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to support long-term recovery efforts in communities affected by natural disasters. In January 2025, GHURA was designated to manage \$500.8 million dollars in CDBG-DR funds to help low- to moderate-income (LMI) households recover from Typhoon Mawar. Over the next six years, Fix in Six will help LMI communities by supporting affordable housing, improving public infrastructure, creating economic opportunities, and strengthening mitigation efforts.
